"Living Well with PD" means that you've got a sense of hope, fuelled by a will, enabling you to get the most out of every day.



What is Parkinson's Disease?

Parkinson's Disease (PD) is a degenerative disorder which affects nerve cells in the brain that produce dopamine. PD symptoms may include tremors, slowness of movement, muscle rigidity, changes in speech, swallowing problems, depression, and gait issues. Without a cure, patients rely on treatment with medications to help relieve symptoms, improve quality of life, and prolong life expectancy.

A major challenge that many people with PD around the world face is the inability to access or afford the medications they need.



Here's How Your Donations Provide Free Parkinson's Medication

 Patient is diagnosed with PD, usually after referral to a neurologist and medications are prescribed.



The neurologist (or qualified MD)
 recognizes there are several patients
 who cannot afford or access PD
 medications and connects with WPP
 and applies for the medication
 program.



 The WPP confirms the patient need and the qualifications of the MD or neurologist through reviewing of documentation.
 For certain locations, WPP will also source a local pharmacy to provide the medication and review their credentials.



5. The WPP's Medication Committee proactively reviews the list of upcoming patient refills by global chapter and generally continues providing medication on a 6-month basis. Note: The WPP is able to continue to provide PD medications for free because of our generous donors. Patients are not charged any fees for medications.



4. A legal agreement is established with the MD or neurologist to ensure compliance with regulations and local laws. The WPP then completes the project by wiring funds to the local pharmacy and having them release the medications to the MD or neurologist who further provides them to their patients.
